



PRAYER GUIDE

Before you pray, PAUSE:

Prepare: So often, we are rushed by the busyness of life. Before you get ready to pray, make sure you are in a quiet place away from distractions (TV, phone, etc.). *“When you pray, go into your private room, shut your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.” Matthew 6:6*

Ask: If there is any unconfessed sin in your life, confess those to God before you begin to pray. *“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.” 1 John 1:9*

Understand: Prayer is a dialogue, not a monologue. As you begin to pray, don't treat this time as a one-sided script but as a conversation between you and God. Allow the Spirit to prompt your soul and mind as you pray. *“May they all be one, as you, Father, are in me, and I am in you.” John 17:21*

Sit: Jesus gives us many examples of going to a place of solitude to pray, but He also shows us what an unhurried life looks like. Before you pray, take 2-5 minutes to sit in silence, breathe, and allow the Spirit to refresh your soul as you rest in the presence of God. *“On that day, Jesus went out of the house and was sitting by the sea.” Matthew 13:1*

Exercise: Prayer is more practice than it is theory. It is simply learned by discovery. *“One of his disciples said to him, Lord, teach us to pray, just as John also taught his disciples. He said to them, “Whenever you pray, say, Father, your name be honored as holy. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves also forgive everyone in debt to us. And do not bring us into temptation.” Luke 11:1-4*
